BSTA High School Dance Participation Regulations and Contract

Prior to participating in any dance sponsored by any group affiliated with BSTA High School, students and parents must sign the following regulation sheet. Anyone who violates the outlined regulations will not be allowed into the dance and/or will be removed from the dance. Once inside the dance, if students alter their attire and/or behavior so as to violate the regulations, they will be escorted out of the dance and not be allowed to return. Students in violation of these regulations may not be allowed to attend any other dances at BSTA High School. <u>Ticket purchases will not be refunded</u>. <u>Students coming from other schools must comply with these regulations</u>.

Place a check mark in the boxes to indicate you have read and understand the rule.

Bringing a Guest:

to:

- They must sign the guest form and bring it to enter the dance.
- Must bring current school ID
- Your guest must comply with all school rules and remain with you throughout the evening.
 Attire: Dress that may be construed as inappropriate under this policy includes, but is not limited
- Revealing clothing; too tight, too short, too low cut in front (revealing cleavage) or back (no lower than shoulder blades), no bare midriffs, sheer fabric where underwear, cleavage, midriff, or back is revealed, any other display of undergarments.
- No short shorts or skirts; shorts/skirts must be no shorter than midthigh including slits.
 - Clothing that is extreme or slovenly (oversized, baggy, or torn jeans) is for protest, defiance, dissent, or displays obscene, illegal substances, or suggestive words or pictures is not permitted.
 - The decision made by an administrator, resource officer, dance advisor, and/or adult chaperone must be adhered to or a student may be removed from the dance.

Behavior: Students that exhibit any behavior that is inappropriate or may potentially harm them or any student around them may be removed from the dance. Behavior that is considered inappropriate under this policy includes, but is not limited to:

- Vulgar, seductive, or inappropriate movements; "freaking", freak dancing, grinding, etc.
- "Moshing", dancing in a "mosh pit", slamming, etc. where students are violently pushing or shoving others.
- Crowd surfing, passing students overhead or through the crowd, etc.
- Running through or around the dance area.
- Running through or around the school building in off limited areas

Recommended attire for Dances at BSTA:

Formal Dances: Tuxedos, Full Suits, Formal Prom or Ball Gowns
Semi Formal Dances: Shirts with collars, slacks, sports jackets, ties, Dresses, not formal or ball gowns

Casual or Costume/Theme Dances: Attire is usually related with a theme or costume. If not, regular school dress is appropriate.

Students (Guest) from Another School:

- Guests must remain with the BSTA student at all times.
- Must adhere to all high school dance regulations.
- Have a current School ID to prove who they are and the student is in high school.
- Have Parent or Legal Guardian sign contract

Attire: Dress that may be construed as inappropriate under this policy includes, but is not limited

to:

- Revealing clothing; too tight, too short, too low cut in front (revealing cleavage) or back (no lower than shoulder blades), no bare midriffs, sheer fabric where underwear, cleavage, midriff, or back is revealed, any other display of undergarments.
- No short shorts or skirts; shorts/skirts must be no shorter than midthigh including slits.
- Clothing that is extreme or slovenly (oversized, baggy, or torn jeans) is for protest, defiance, dissent, or displays obscene, illegal substances, or suggestive words or pictures is not permitted.
- The decision made by an administrator, resource officer, dance advisor, and/or adult chaperone must be adhered to or a student may be removed from the dance.

Behavior: Students that exhibit any behavior that is inappropriate or may potentially harm them or any student around them may be removed from the dance. Behavior that is considered inappropriate under this policy includes, but is not limited to:

- Vulgar, seductive, or inappropriate movements; "freaking", freak dancing, grinding, etc.
- "Moshing", dancing in a "mosh pit", slamming, etc. where students are violently pushing or shoving others.
- Crowd surfing, passing students overhead or through the crowd, etc.
- Running through or around the dance area.
- Running through or around the school building in off limited areas

Recommended attire for Dances at BSTA:

Formal Dances: Tuxedos, Full Suits, Formal Prom or Ball Gowns
Semi Formal Dances: Shirts with collars, slacks, sports jackets, ties, Dresses, not formal or ball gowns.

Casual or Costume/Theme Dances: Attire is usually related with a theme or costume. If not, regular school dress is appropriate.
