- b. Graduation/Prom Plans
 - i. Prom was held last Saturday, May 16, at Wheeler Farm.
 - ii. A total of 85 students attended.
 - iii. Graduation will be held May 21 at Salt Lake Community College.
 - iv. Forty-five students will graduate, making this the largest graduating class to date.
 - v. Graduation will be a ticketed event for the first time.
- c. Enrollment
 - i. Approximately 1,000 students are enrolled, including returning and newly enrolled students.
 - ii. Some grades still have open seats, while others currently have waitlists.
- d. Summer Robotics Classes
 - i. Robotics club students will mentor and teach younger students.
 - ii. Three separate sessions will be offered, each with unique content.
 - iii. Students entering 1st through 8th grade are eligible to participate.
 - iv. Cost: \$150 per week.
- e. STEM Vending Machines
 - i. The goal is to inspire elementary students and strengthen the school's STEM community identity.
 - ii. Current rewards consist of small trinkets and function more as classroom incentives than larger rewards.
 - iii. Proposed rewards would include tokens redeemable for STEM kits from a STEM vending machine.
 - iv. Estimated cost of the machine: \$6,200.
 - v. Initial purchase of 100 STEM kits: \$1,375.
 - 1. Lower-cost or alternative STEM kits could be used in the future

- vi. Parent donations are being sought to help fund the purchase of the machine.
